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Restaurant coming to King's Crossing

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Terroir, a restaurant and wine bar, has signed a lease in the new King's Crossing project.

Located on N.E. Fremont Street between Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard and Grand Avenue in northeast Portland's King neighborhood, the site has been known as the Fremont Project site and formerly housed the King Food Market.

Terroir will occupy 2,400 square feet in the building on one floor. It will be open for dinner 4-10 p.m. Tuesday through Sunday. The restaurant will seat 60 inside with 20 seats outside -- weather permitting.

Owners Stu Stein and Mary Hinds are planning to open in May. Once fully operating, the restaurant is expected to employ 25 staff.

In addition to the new restaurant, the project contains another 1,300 square feet of ground floor retail space and 5,600 square feet of new office space on the second floor that enjoys views of the neighborhood and the city.

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
